

Headline successes

- Pupils continue to have two hours of physical education timetabled a week. This comprises of one hour inside and one hour outside. Teachers follow a scheme of work which is progressive.
- ▶ Whole staff CPD including other schools in the academy trust attended a session for OAA training at our school
- ▶ Pupils at Marian Vian have continued to have the opportunity to participate in a wide number of extra-curricular clubs which are well attended.
- ► Employment of School Games website to promote school performance regarding intra and inter competition.
- ► Membership and involvement of inclusive school games to support SEN pupil needs and interests.
- ▶ Increased employment of physical activity, interactive resources to address 30/30 active challenge (e.g. 5-a-day, SuperMovers).
- ► Increase in school club-links pathway e.g. Lovegrove Academy for Hockey
- ► Enhancement of outdoor environment to promote active learning e.g. Bushcraft
- ► Subject leader partaking in Level 5 Qualification for Physical Education Subject Leadership
- ► Football introduced to more pupils and tournaments taken place
- Achieved the gold accreditation for the School Games Award.

Key focuses with predictions

- ► Curriculum Management CPD training through borough advisory service (Giles Platt, Regional PE & PSHE Advisor)
- Ongoing participation within intra and inter competition
- To embed assessment procedures and provide staff training on using AFL tasks.
- ► Continue to develop the intra-school competitions so that all pupils across the year have regular opportunities to compete against others.
- Continue to develop innovative ways of encouraging the non-sporting participants to participate in extra-curricular activities.
- ▶ Initiate development of creating more cross-curricular links with physical education and physical activity incorporated into other curriculum areas.
- Introduce the training programme for Play Leaders with older pupils.
